SESSION I (LISTENING and READING)

SECTION I: LISTENING COMPREHENSION (25 pts.)

- **Objective:** To assess the ability to understand a range of spoken materials, including short monologues, conversations, and extended talks on both familiar and abstract topics.
- **Total Time:** Approximately 40 minutes.
- Structure: 4 parts, 20 questions total. All audio recordings are played **TWICE.**

• **Structure:** 4 parts, 20 questions total.

SESSION II: WRITING (25 pts.)

• **Objective:** To assess students' ability to produce written texts in two different formats: an integrated summary based on a listening text and an independent essay on a given topic. The session evaluates skills in synthesis, argumentation, organisation, and linguistic accuracy.

- **Total Time:** 75 minutes (This time is allocated for writing only and does not include the listening portion of Part 1).
- **Structure:** 2 parts (Integrated Writing, Writing a Text).

SESSION III: SPEAKING (25 pts.)

• **Objective:** To assess a candidate's ability to communicate effectively in English on both familiar and abstract topics. The test evaluates oral fluency, lexical and grammatical resources, pronunciation, and the ability to structure and justify opinions.

- **Total Time:** 7-10 minutes per candidate.
- **Format:** A structured, one-on-one interview with two interlocutors.
- **Structure:** 2 parts, moving from personal experience to expressing and defending an opinion.
